The story of Saul's conversion on the road to Damascus is paired with the Gospel account of Jesus giving the charge to Peter, "Feed My Lambs." Apostles are God's gift to the church, particularly because they were directly entrusted with the Ministry of the Word by the risen Jesus Himself speaking to them. The church that is founded by the Word proclaimed by the apostles is therefore called the "apostolic" church, yet the church is "apostolic" also in the sense that our Lord sends His church into the world to tend His sheep and proclaim the words of the Shepherd to all the lost whom He calls.
